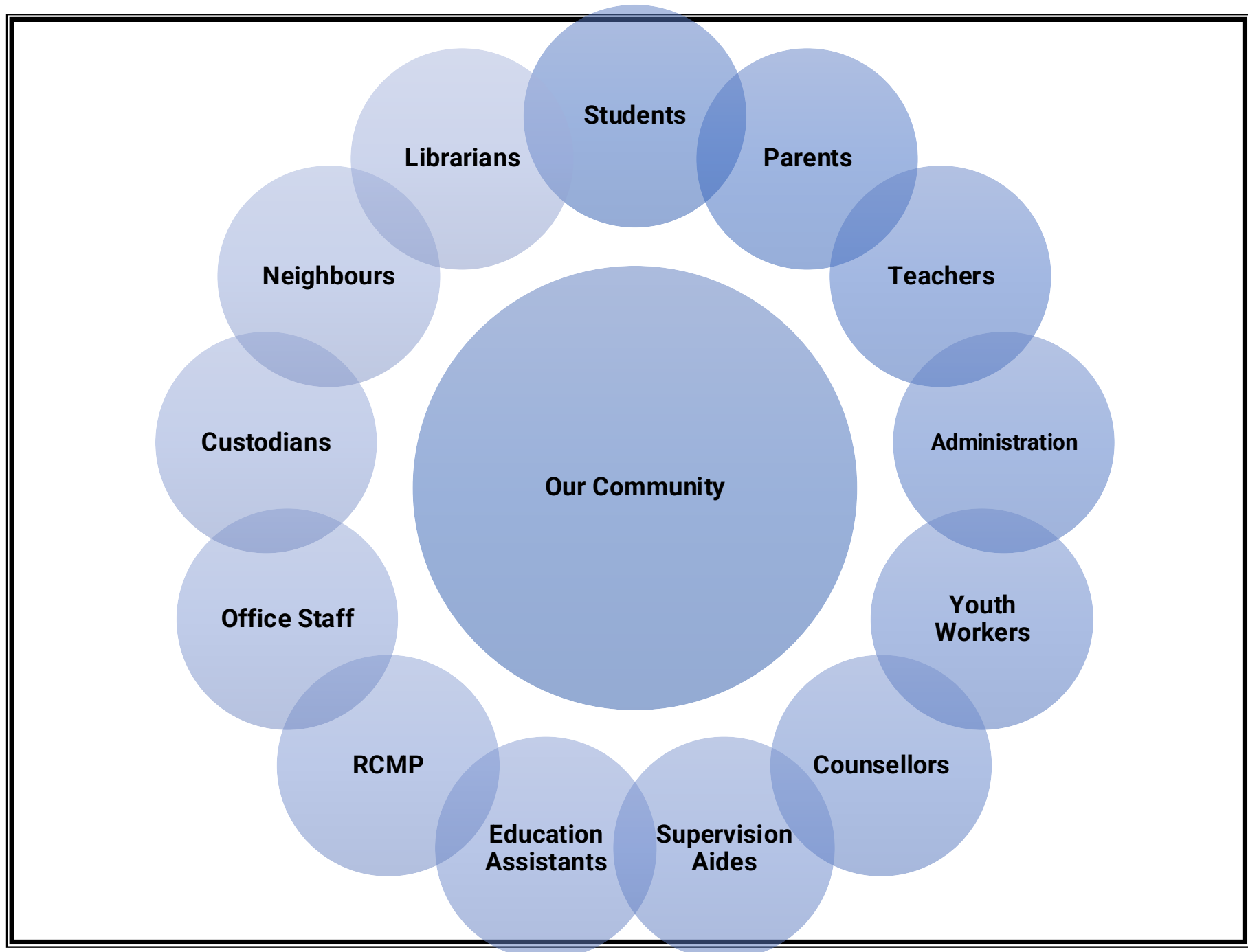

REQUESTING COURSE CHANGES

Course Change Window: Sept 9th to September 23rd

- Students with errors in their timetable, missing courses, or requests for a CHANGE, must pick up a course change form from Office, complete and return it signed
 - Students must REMAIN in scheduled class UNTIL change is confirmed (attendance)
 - Counsellors will be in touch when they have reviewed completed form
 - Requests are not guaranteed



APPLICATION FOR TIMETABLE ADJUSTMENT 2026-2027

Course 'Drop' Window: October 5th -October 9th, December 14th – December 18th,
& March 30th – April 2nd ONLY

Seycove Secondary requires students to take the following MINIMUM number of face-to-face courses:

Grade	Courses
8	8
9	8
10	8
11	7 (By Application)
12	6 + CLC 12 (4 credits)

Consideration is given to individual students who, for extenuating circumstances, may need to consider a partial timetable and enroll in fewer courses. **Students must apply to drop courses within the Course Drop windows.** Some considerations are:

- Health concerns that limit ability for full time attendance
- Cross-enrollment with a different school or district program (i.e. YELL, Peak Performance)

Note – requests to focus on academic coursework will not be considered extenuating circumstances

Timetable Adjustment Application Window: October 5th – October 9th

- Students cannot request to drop courses unless it's within the window
- Students MAY apply for a Timetable Adjustment
- Must TRY course before a drop is considered
- Students MUST remain in course until any adjustment to courseload is approved by counsellor and admin

NVSD Code of Conduct

North Vancouver School District's Code of Conduct has been established to maintain a safe, caring, accessible, and healthy learning environment.

It is the shared responsibility of students, staff, parents/guardians, and the broader community, to demonstrate positive conduct while attending any school or district related activity, at any location.

All members of the school community are expected to:

- Support learning and attendance.
- Demonstrate safety.
- Respect property, environment, personal space, and privacy.
- Model courtesy, compassion, and respect.
- Value diversity.
- Treat self and all other members of the school and broader community respectfully.

All members of the school community must refrain from engaging in any in-person or digital communication or participating in behaviour that is considered to be:

- Interfering with the learning and working of others.
- Bullying, harassing, intimidating, retaliating, discriminating or violent.
- Unsafe or illegal, including the possession, use, or distribution of illegal or restricted substances or the possession of weapons or replicas.

All members of the school community are expected to:

- Comply with the purpose and spirit of the BC Human Rights Code, including not engaging in discriminatory conduct based on Indigenous identity, race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, religion, marital status, family status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, or age of that person or that group or class of persons.
- Wear clothing that does not promote or symbolize illegal substances or activities, hate or discrimination, profanity, pornography, or that incites violence, harassment, or threatens safety.
- Leave personal digital devices at home, in their bag/backpack, and/or in their locker during instructional time. Allowances may be made by the staff for instructional purposes, digital literacy, appropriate use based on age and developmental stage, accommodations within a student's Individualized Education Plan, accessibility, medical and health needs, and/or equitable support for learning outcomes.

Every effort will be made to support individuals and to determine the root causes of behaviour. If the safety or educational program of others is compromised, or if there is an ongoing failure to meet the expectations of the Code of Conduct, a range of consequences will follow. Whenever possible, incidents will be resolved by discussion, community service, restorative processes, referral to counselling and/or support services, mediation, and restitution, but may involve loss of privileges, detention, suspension from school, and/or collaboration with community partners. Confidentiality will be maintained; however, school officials may have a responsibility to advise other parties of serious breaches of the Code of Conduct (e.g. school district officials, law enforcement, and/or other agencies, etc.).

PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICES

Show Up for Your Learning

Being Present Matters

- Learning happens **every day**, not just on test days.
- Your learning is assessed over time through conversations, activities, practice, projects, and assignments.
- If you miss class, you miss learning that can't always be recreated or “made up.”
- Being away doesn't simply mean completing a worksheet or writing a test later.
- Regular attendance is essential to successfully completing and earning credit for your courses.
- If something is getting in the way of coming to school, talk to us early. Your teachers, counsellors, and admin team are here to help you make a plan.

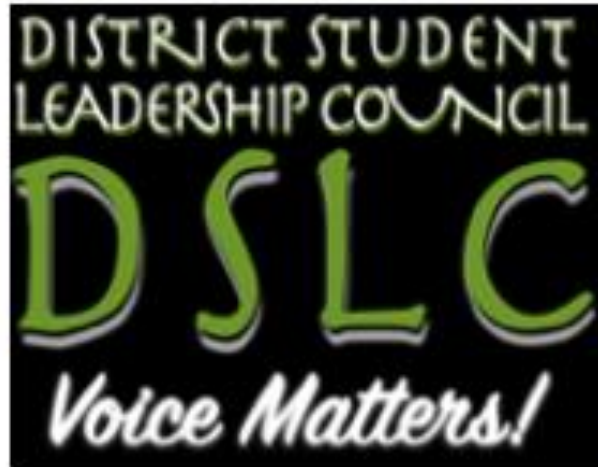

VISITORS, GUESTS, VOLUNTEERS

- All visitors must make appointments prior to entering the school

MAKE SAFE CHOICES

- **Walk**

 - Skateboarding is not permitted on school property

 - Cafeteria (***not in front round about***)
 - Note the signs
- **Drivers - Drive responsibly! Fill out Form in the Office.**
 - 15km/hr speed limit



KNOW THE DIFFERENCE - RIDE LEGAL



E-BIKES

Pedal assist with motor

- ✓ 14+ (light) / 16+ (standard)
- ✓ Up to 25 km/h (light) or 32 km/h (standard)
- ✓ No license or insurance
- ✓ Legal on bike lanes, paths and roads



E-SCOOTERS

Electric stand-up scooters

- ✓ 16+
- ✓ Up to 25 km/h
- ✓ No license or insurance
- ✓ Where permitted (check local rules)



ELECTRIC MOTORCYCLES

High-powered e-bikes (E.g., Surron Style)

- ✗ Not street legal
- ✗ Require license, insurance and registration
- ✗ Not permitted on roads, sidewalks, bike lanes or public pathways.

KEEP YOUR THINGS SAFE



If you leave valuables at school...

- Keep items on your person or in your locker
- Keep your combination private
 - **ALWAYS** use a lock for PHE/Athletics
 - Do not leave your bag unattended
 - The school is not responsible for lost/stolen property

BE AWARE OF WHAT TO DO



- Assembly area is along the outside of the Field
- Ask teachers about your plan & follow their instructions
- Fire & Earthquake Drills & Lockdown drills will occur throughout the year
- Report **all** injuries to the office

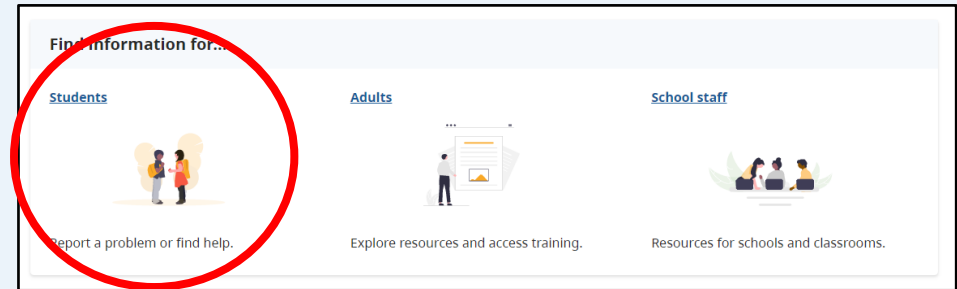
